The Pastor's Corner

Do you feel it? I do. The Spirit is on the move.

In the course of my ministerial duties I find myself reflecting on and attempting to capture in words the essence that is so palpable at First Congregational Church. It is clearly God at work. But it's also us at work, me and you.



In broad strokes I think we have three core values that are undergirding and shaping our common life:

First there is a clear spiritual yearning, some may say spiritual intelligence or a drive for **spiritual discovery**, which is propelling our worship attendance, children's programing and overall energy. There is an undeniable sense of the Holy One that weaves throughout our church services, is mingling with us in coffee hour, and is beating in our hearts in the wee hours of the night. We long for a deeper, more informed, connection with our creator. Together we're unafraid to ask hard questions, to pray for each other, and to seek Jesus' presence in the world. This is foundational to who we are as a people of God.

Second, in our time together we have increasingly lived into our commitment to be an **inclusive community**. This value embraces and yet extends beyond our Open and Affirming statement. Together we are creating an atmosphere of welcome and inclusion not only for the activities of the church but for the church property itself. Do you know that we host daily AA meetings, 10 scout troops (boys, girls, and co-ed), that we're home to a driving school, robotics club, Tamil Cultural program, Aprende Spanish Immersion Daycare, Weight Watchers, Worcester Youth Orchestra, singers, quilters, UCC Central Association committees and so much more. Our building, as an extension of our ministry, says 'no matter who you are on life's journey, you're welcome here.'

Finally we, together, have a hallmark of **compassionate service**. Our faith compels us into action- caring not only for one another but for God's children across the region and throughout the world. There are small acts of kindness that take place every day in our congregation and bigger more organized efforts through our mission and outreach ministry. From collecting fruit for veterans to planting trees or helping at Community Harvest, through giving in UCC offerings or to cooking meals for Mustard Seed there are innumerable ways in which our faith is made manifest in our actions.

As a whole, what we are doing, who we are becoming, what God has in store- in us and through us- makes a difference. BECAUSE OF YOU OUR CHURCH CHANGES LIVES.

The ministry we undertake as a congregation, the transformational work of FCC, takes place because of YOU. When YOU come to worship- ministry happens, when YOU greet someone with a smile- ministry happens, when YOU give back through volunteer workministry happens- BECAUSE OF YOU OUR CHURCH CHANGES LIVES.





Request for Payment of Capital Campaign Pledges for Organ Rebuild

The following is a summary on where we stand on our financing of the organ rebuild.

Fund as of 5/11/23: \$154,577

Since the Capital Campaign is spread out over 3 years, people who participated in the Capital Campaign have the option of paying their pledges over that period of time. However, based on the current pledge payments, we are \$154,577 short of the \$200,520 that is due between June and the end of August. Unfortunately, we will need to borrow this amount from our Antenna Fund and paying it back as the pledges are received. Based on this, we are humbly asking, if at all possible, if you could submit any outstanding amounts that you have pledged for the organ rebuild as soon as possible to minimize the cost of borrowing from our Antenna Fund. Individuals, groups, businesses and clubs are encouraged to display their scarecrows for all to enjoy. There will be no judging but all registered entries will receive special recognition.

How to enter:


- 1. Create your scarecrow(s) at home.
- 2. Bring them to the Town Common the week of September 18th
- 3. Choose a spot to display your scarecrow.
- 4. You are responsible for installation. No poles will be provided.
- 5. Name of club, group, business or individual(s) must appear on the scarecrow.
- 6. Your entry will remain outdoors for an extended period of time, no perishable goods such as pumpkins, gourds, squash, apples, tomatoes, etc. will be permitted. No electricity is provided but solar, battery or wind power is allowed.
- 7. Scarecrows MAY NOT be attached to the bandstand, memorial, newly planted trees or lamp posts.
- 8. Scarecrows MUST remain on the Common through October 20th and then REMOVED. Any scarecrows remaining after October 22nd will be discarded at owners expense.

The Shrewsbury Garden Club has the right to refuse any entry they feel unacceptable or inappropriate and are not responsible for loss or damage to scarecrows while on display.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Make your church the safest place in town.

To all our outside groups, committees, and ministries:

Churches are meant to be sanctuaries with open doors and safe spaces where people can enter and meet in peace and harmony.

Church building security is a topic that has become critical in the last ten years as problems such as intruders and property damage have been increasing. With the right protocols and systems in place, a church can better protect its community from unauthorized access, theft or violence.

First Congregational Church Shrewsbury, is home to both internal committees and community groups such as the Scouts, Twelve Step groups, preschools, and more. The presence of young children has increased the need for safety.

Our church has implemented a variety of safety measures including key cards, which allow doors to the main exterior doors to remain locked. Unfortunately, we have noticed that there are a variety of doors and windows that have been left open and/or unlocked, creating safety hazards for all.

We would appreciate if everyone using the building could follow these simple guidelines:

- 1. Enter through the main entrance only, using the key card.
- 2. Do not prop the entrance doors open or the door by the kitchen (unless carrying items in the building for limited amounts of time while an individual remains at the door).
- 3. Please be attentive to all posted signs regarding building use.
- 4. Open only essential windows and doors while in immediate use, close and lock promptly after use.
- 5. Exit the building through the main door, making sure all the doors and windows are locked and all lights are turned off.
