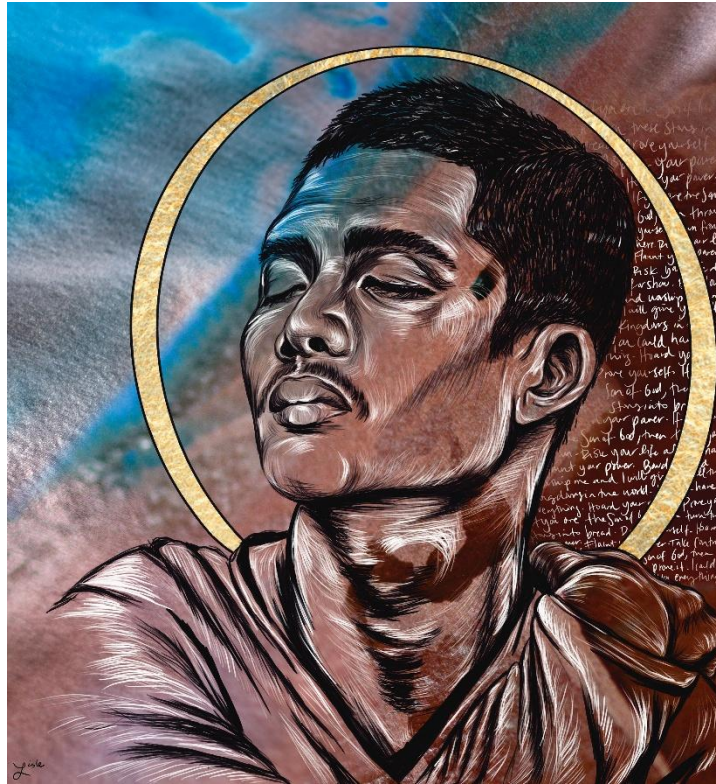

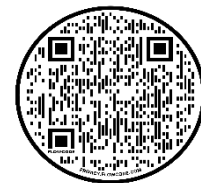

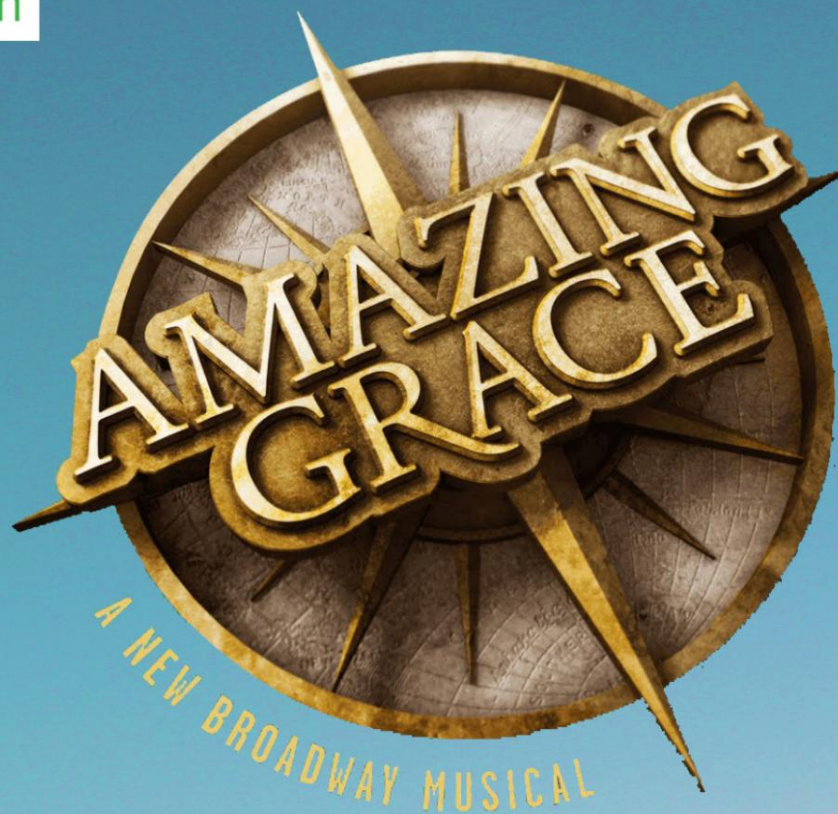

Dollars & Sense is a monthly feature, generally the 3rd week of the month, where we share information about different aspects of our financial health as a congregation.

Cell Tower Income

First Congregational Church first explored the possibility of using our steeple as a cell phone tower in the late 1990's. Initially contracts were developed with the four major cell phone providers at that time: AT&T (1999), Verizon (2001), Sprint (2002) and T-Mobile (2005). In 2020 T-Mobile and Sprint merged. The original AT&T contract was monetized with a 20-year contract in 2004. At the conclusion of that contract in 2024, that revenue stream reverted to direct payments to the Church.

The initial investment in the cell phone contracts allowed FCC to set up what was then known as the "Antenna Fund" which was used to close any significant deficits from our annual operating budget. In 2024 the name of that fund was changed to "The Stabilization Fund" to better describe its function. In our 2026 budget we estimate a \$39,600 transfer from The Stabilization Fund to help cover the cost of our operating budget.

Over the years the monthly income from the cell phone companies have helped the church to pay for significant expenses, including using those funds to pay off the mortgage on the new parsonage. Additionally, income from the cell tower rentals have contributed to the growth of our endowment.

In 2025 the church leadership embarked on a significant project to monetize one of our three remaining cell tower contracts. Working with a 3rd party vendor we again negotiated a one-time lump sum payment in lieu of 50 years of monthly rental on our AT&T lease. Doing so diversifies our cell tower income portfolio and ensures that FCC has the resources on hand to invest through our endowment to undergird the long-term sustainability of the church.

With the endowment receiving a significant increase from the monetization of the AT&T lease, the two remaining monthly cell tower leases, T-mobile and Verizon, will now be distributed to The Stabilization Fund and to a restricted Capital Fund. The Capital Fund is designed to accumulate money for us to address building related projects that are outside of the scope of our normal annual budget.
